# Options after High School

### Workforce/Apprenticeship

- On-the-job short-term or long-term training is provided by an employer at the beginning of a new job.
- Training can last 1 5 years, often paid.
- The completion of an apprenticeship is generally associated with skilled labor.
- These kinds of programs can lead to secure and well-paying jobs without the need for any college expenses.

# Military/Armed Forces

- Five Branches: Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, Coast Guard, & Space Force
  - Reserves and National Guard are various options within these branches
- Different requirements for each branch:
  - Citizenship & Residency
  - Age Limits
  - ▶ Education: High School Diploma or GED are required for enlisting; officer requires college
  - Testing: Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB)
  - Physical and Medical Requirements
- In general: Contact Recruiter → Take the ASVAB → Graduate HS → Request Final Transcript

### Trade School

- Must have HS Diploma or GED to attend
- Typically completed in two years or less
- Certificate or Diploma programs
  - Can qualify for HOPE Grant or HOPE Career Grant (\$\$\$)
- Career-focused
  - Trains students for a specific job in a career field
- Examples of jobs:
  - Welding, Cosmetology, Construction Worker, Automotive, HVAC, Electrician, Dental Assistant, Carpenter, Plumber, Practical Nurse, etc.

# 2-Year Colleges & Technical Colleges

### See if the SAT/ACT is required-

may take the Accuplacer Exam instead- check with each individual school

### Two-year school requirements –

2.0 GPA, 2 World Languages, senior level math plus all Georgia graduation requirements

**Transcript Requests-** Require a FINAL transcript as proof of graduation.

### Four-Year Colleges & Universities

- Typically have higher admission requirements
  - i.e. higher GPA, higher test scores
- Typically takes students four years to complete
- Students work towards a Bachelor's Degree
  - After graduating- can pursue Master's or Doctorate after completion
- SAT/ACT Test Scores may be required
  - Check Admission Requirements for college

# Step 1: Build a List of Colleges

# BUILDING A COLLEGE LIST

"Reach schools" are those where your academic credentials fall <u>below</u> the school's average range for the freshman class.

"Range schools" are schools where your academic credentials fall within or perhaps slightly exceed the school's average range for the freshman class.

"Safety schools" are schools you will almost definitely get into because your academic credentials are <u>much better</u> than the typical average range for the freshman class.

#### **REACH SCHOOLS**

Apply to 1 or 2

#### **RANGE SCHOOLS**

Apply to 2 or 3

#### **SAFETY SCHOOLS**

Apply to at least 1

Check Admissions Requirements by visiting College website.



Most colleges only consider academic classes when calculating GPAs.



Weighted and unweighted GPAs will be reported on your CCSD transcript.



Class rank will not be included on transcripts or reported on secondary reports.



Colleges want students who are involved in their communities.

# Do you need to take the SAT/ACT?

# The ACT and SAT are not required for TECHNICAL Colleges

• Chattahoochee Technical College, Gwinnett Technical College, etc.

# It may be required for 4-year or 2-year colleges

• Kennesaw State University, Georgia Highlands College, etc.

Scholarships may ask for ACT/SAT Scores

# SAT or ACT Test Scores are NOW REQUIRED for more USG Colleges

- Applicants are required to take the SAT or ACT for the following Georgia Colleges:
  - University of Georgia
  - Georgia Tech
  - Georgia College & State University
  - Kennesaw State University
  - Georgia State University
  - Augusta University
  - Georgia Southern University
- Please check admission requirements for all other colleges (in-state or out-of-state)

# University System of GA test optional info

The University System of Georgia (USG) will continue the temporary waiver of test score requirements for Academic Year 2026-2027 (Fall 2026, Spring 2027, and Summer 2026) admission at 19 of the 26 USG institutions.

The temporary waiver does not apply to Georgia Tech, the University of Georgia, Kennesaw State University, Augusta University, Georgia Southern University, Georgia State University, or Georgia College and State University.

For Academic Year 2025-2026, the remaining institutions have two options to make admission decisions:

- 1.Freshman index: Includes high school grade point average and test scores for either the SAT or ACT.
- 2.Test Optional: Use the high school grade point average on the required high school curriculum without a standardized test score at the following minimum grade point averages:
  - 3.4 for research universities. Augusta University and Georgia State
    University.
  - 3.2 for comprehensive universities: Kennesaw State University, Georgia Southern University, University of West Georgia and Valdosta State University.
  - 3.0 for state universities: Albany State University, Clayton State
    University, Columbus State University, Fort Valley State University,
    Georgia Southwestern State University, Middle Georgia State
    University, Savannah State University and the University of North
    Georgia.
  - State colleges: Abraham Baldwin Agricultural College, Atlanta Metropolitan State College, College of Coastal Georgia, Dalton State College, East Georgia State College, Georgia Gwinnett College, Georgia Highlands College, Gordon State College and South Georgia State College will continue to be test optional in accordance with Board policy.



## Naviance Student Homepage

Ocollege: Associate's Degree

Earn an associate's degree or certificate in two years or less by attending a two-year community college or junior college.

Ocollege: Bachelor's Degree

Earn a Bachelor's degree in four years by attending a four-year private or public college or university.

Career Education or Trade School

Enroll in a short-term training program at a career or vocational-technical college and earn a certificate or associate's degree for an industry such as health care, cosmetology, and plumbing.

Apprenticeship Program

Enroll in an apprenticeship to get on-the-job training with classroom instruction and mentorship that leads to a skilled trade or profession.

O Military Service

Enlist in a branch of the U.S. Armed Forces right after high school or join after college by enrolling in a Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) program.

Employment

Enter the job force right after high school to develop work skills and learn on the job without any formal training or education.

Undecided

Not sure what to do after high school? Talk to a school counselor about different pathways to help decide what's best.

O Gap or Service Year

Take a gap or service year between high school and the start of my post-secondary path. Engage in service work, educational activities, or travel to give back to a community or to help decide a future goal.

# Understanding Application Types

#### Regular Decision

Deadline date established by the institution

#### ▶ Early Decision (I &II): Binding

- Cannot apply early decision to other colleges, can only apply regular decision.
- If accepted, must attend (BINDING)
- Early Action: Non-Binding
  - Can apply early to other colleges, can apply regular decision
  - Student is ready to apply (ACT/SAT Scores, GPA)
- Single Choice/Restricted Early Action: Non-Binding
  - Cannot apply early to other colleges, can apply regular decision

#### Rolling Admission

 Open admission, decisions given throughout the year not at a specific time

#### Priority Deadline

Similar to rolling admissions but priority given to those applicants who meet earlier priority deadline

### Regular Decision vs. Early Action

- Provides earlier decision for scholarship applications & more informed/earlier decision for student
- It is the same review process
- Easy answer: Is your application ready by the Early Action deadline?
  - Grades through the end of Junior Year
  - Consider rigor of student's courses (AP and Honors)
  - ► SAT/ACT Scores
- Early Action Results
  - Admission
  - Deferral- student's application is considered for Regular Decision review
  - Denial- does not meet Early Action or Regular Decision acceptance

# Take Note! Upcoming Early Action Deadlines

- Beware of upcoming Georgia application deadlines!
- ▶ University of Georgia October 15, 2025
- ▶ Georgia Tech- October 15, 2025
- Emory University November 1, 2025 (Early Decision-Binding)
- Check the college's website for Early Action deadlines for the college you are interested in applying

### Step-by-Step Process

- 1. Choose which colleges you're applying to
- 2. Know how you need to apply:
  - Common App, Common Black College App, through college website, GAFutures, etc.
- 3. Submit your college applications using designated method
- Send your test scores via Collegeboard or ACT (this cannot be done by HS!)
- 5. Use Naviance to:
  - List the college you applied to for transcript to be sent
  - 2. Invite teacher recommenders




Complete and submit your applications as directed by the college- know Deadlines!

Take your time completing your application and essays – this is a very important step!

### Add College to the "Colleges I'm Applying to"

- This is the section where students will spend most of their time.
- You can request TEACHER letters of recommendation within this section.
- You must also designate the application type within this section as well as indicate that you've applied to the school.
  - EX: did you apply through CommonApp?
  - Ex: did you apply directly to the institution, GAFutures, Common Black College App?

(Mail Only)-This icon represents colleges that only accept documents submitted via mail. The school does not accept documents electronically.

(Electronic)-This icon represents electronic destinations that accept documents electronically via

(Common App)-This icon represents Common App destinations that accept documents electronically via Naviance eDocs. It's important to note this icon means the student has explicitly chosen to apply via Common App and indicated "Yes" in Family Connection > Colleges I'm Applying to. However, on College tabs (showing the college profile) it indicates the fact that it's a CA college, but not whether the student is applying via CA.

(Unknown)-This icon is displayed when a student adds a Common App college but has not indicated whether or not he or she plans to apply via the Common App Online. This status does not prohibit you from submitting Common App forms for the student, but you will receive a warning message advising you that the student has not indicated their plan. A message is displayed to inform the school counselor that the student had not made a selection whether applying via Common App and submission would default to Common App delivery.

(Common App via Electronic)-This icon is displayed when a student has selected a Common App college and has indicated that he or she is not applying via the Common App Online. However, if the school is also an electronic destination (in addition to Common App) you can continue to submit documents (NACAC and other school forms, transcripts, and letters of recommendation) electronically.



(Common App mail only)-This icon displays when a student has selected a Common App college and has indicated that he or she is not applying via the Common App Online. However, the school is not an electronic destination so you will have to print and mail (other school forms, transcripts, and letters of recommendation) to the destination.

## "Colleges I'm Applying to" Dashboard

## Common App

- The Common App is an undergraduate college admission application that applicants may use to apply to any of the 500+ member colleges and universities.
- If a school uses Common App, use Common App.
- You can access the Common App by going to www.commonapp.org
- Some schools are Common App exclusive, which means they do not accept any application other than the Common App. Some schools accept both the Common App and their own individualized, web-based application or the Coalition Application.
- Of course, this does not apply for schools who do not accept the Common App. To view the 500 schools that accept the Common App, check out the members page of the Common App website.
- Limit your Common App to 20 school maximum if possible.



## Common App Matching

For Common App schools, students are required to match their Common App and Naviance Student accounts.



- In order to match the Common App account, students must first complete the following steps in their Common App account:
  - Complete the Education section of your Common Application
  - Add at least one college to My Colleges tab
  - ▶ Sign the FERPA Release Authorization





### Common Black College App (CBCA)\*

- Single application for 67 Historically Black Colleges/Universities
- Only \$20 application fee to apply to all HBCU's using CBCA
  - ▶ You will select top 4 colleges. Your application is available to all other colleges but they may not review if they are not in your top 4. You will need to contact those colleges regarding your application.
- Your school counselor will upload your transcript to the CBCA website after you complete \$2 payment

## Non-Common App Schools

- Some colleges and universities have opted not to accept the Common Application or Coalition.
- Instead, they have created their own individual applications that, in most cases, are web-based and can be found via the school's undergraduate admissions website.
- Just because a school does not accept the Common App does not mean that they do not accept the transmission of important documents, like letters of recommendation and academic transcripts, through Naviance.
- When a non-Common App school allows us to submit documents through Naviance, it is called Direct to Institution. A Direct to Institution school is designated by this symbol.

### Teacher Recommendations


- Allow <u>at least 3-4 weeks</u> for teachers to complete their recommendation portion of your application!
- ► ASK EARLY!!!
- Students "invite" their teachers to upload and send letters of recommendation in two steps:
  - Provide teachers with a copy of your recommendation packet with a list of schools to which you are asking the teacher to write.
  - 2. Add the request digitally under your "Colleges I'm Applying To" tab.
  - 3. IMPORTANT: ASSIGN YOUR TEACHERS TO SPECIFIC SCHOOLS, NOT "All Applications"
    - -It is your responsibility to research which schools require a letter of recommendation on their website.
    - -If they do not ask for a letter of recommendation, they do not use it in the admissions process. DO NOT ASK YOUR TEACHER FOR ONE IF THIS IS THE CASE!

### Counselor Recommendations/ Secondary School Reports

- If you need a Letter of Recommendation from your School Counselor, please allow 2-3 weeks for your Counselor to write that Letter
- You can reach out to your Counselor through email to request a Letter of Recommendation
- Your Counselor will ask questions that you must answer for us to write a great letter of recommendation (don't be shy with your answers!)



## Step 4: Send Your Transcript

### Requesting Transcripts

- 1. Add college you are applying to Naviance.
  - Log onto your Naviance student account.
  - Click on "Colleges I'm applying to"
  - Click on "(+)", add each college/university, including application information OR MATCH ACCOUNTS (CommonApp Schools)
  - Click "Add Application"
- 2. Go to MyPaymentsPlus and fill out the transcript request form and pay \$2 for your transcript.
  - <u>For Common Application documents, you MUST link your Common App account to your Naviance account before your counselor can send your transcript.</u>
- It is your responsibility to complete ALL parts of the above process, or transcripts will not be sent.



## Step 5: Financial Aid

## Financial Aid-Helps Pay for College

- Financial Aid helps students pay for college
- Types of Financial Aid: Scholarships, Grant, Student Loans, Work-study
- Scholarships and Grants DO NOT have to be repaid
- Student Loans MUST be repaid (amount borrowed + interest)



## Scholarships

- ► Types of Scholarships:
  - Academic, Community Service, Athletic, Hobby/Extracurricular based, Identity based, Need based, Employer or Military
- Check the Scholarship Resources in Naviance on the Colleges Homepage
  - ► Scholarship List- Updated by County and HS
- Check the College Websites and online search engines.
  - ▶ Pay attention to deadlines!!

# Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

- An Application completed by students who want to go to college and want financial aid (help paying for college)
- Will be available to complete October 1, 2025
- Requires tax information from student's family (2024 Taxes)
- Determines how much money your family would be able to contribute to your cost of attending college
- The FAFSA is the application for HOPE Scholarship, Zell Miller Scholarship, HOPE Grant, HOPE Career Grant, and Pell Grant

#### Federal Pell Grant

- Awarded to students who show financial need based on their FAFSA
- NO HIGH SCHOOL GPA Requirement

**Maximum Amount Awarded:** 

\$7,395 per school year (2025-2026)
