OSBORNE SCHOLARSHIP NEWSLETTER:

Scholarships guaranteed to be awarded to Osborne seniors include:

1. **Cobb Schools Foundation Scholarship** (\$2,000 to two OHS Seniors): Due January 31, 2026
2. **The Wilmer Hicks Memorial Scholarship** (\$500 to one OHS Senior): Due January 31, 2026
3. **The Terry Watson Scholarship** (\$1,000 to one OHS Senior): Due February 28, 2026
4. **The Jonquil City Kiwanis Club Scholarship** (\$1,000/year for 4 years to OHS/CHS Senior): Due March 30, 2026
5. **The Tann Lightsey Scholarship** (\$1,000 to one OHS/CHS Senior): Due March 30, 2026

The newsletter will be updated frequently as we receive more scholarship opportunities. We are expecting to receive more opportunities over the next month that either guarantee or prefer Osborne students.

GRADUATION TICKET REQUEST:

Seniors are now able to request graduation tickets! This should be completed as soon as possible. As a reminder, this is a request and NOT a guarantee. The county will notify seniors how many tickets they have been allocated later this semester.

For instructions on how to complete the ticket request, seniors should go to the **Class of 2026** CTLS and look under "Student Coursework" for Graduation Ticket Request.

APPLICATION WORK SESSIONS:

There will be an **Application Work Session** on Friday, February 6th during 1st and 2nd block. Students are welcome to come to the Counseling Office Career Center to work on college and scholarship applications during this time. Registration is not required, but students need to have teacher permission to attend. There is a limit of 25 students max per block.

SPRING APPLY TO COLLEGE MONTH- MARCH:

March is Georgia's Spring Apply to College Month! Many colleges and universities will be waiving their application fees to encourage seniors to submit their applications. Osborne will be hosting some Apply to College events to support seniors who need to work on applications.

- **Thursday, March 5th- FAFSA Completion Event with Georgia Student Finance Commission and Osborne's Hispanic Organization Promoting Education (HOPE) at 5:30pm:** Students and parents who have not completed the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) are encouraged to attend our FAFSA Completion Event! There will be assistance in English and Spanish.
- **Friday, March 6th- Application Work Session 1st and 2nd block:** Registration not required, students must have teacher permission to work on college/scholarship applications in the Career Center, maximum of 25 students
- **Tuesday, March 10th- Apply to Chattahoochee Tech Day:** [Spring 2026 Apply to Chattahoochee Tech Day](#)
- **Friday, March 13th- Application Work Session 1st and 2nd block:** Registration not required, students must have teacher permission to work on college/scholarship applications in the Career Center, maximum of 25 students
- **Tuesday, March 24th- Apply to College Day (all colleges):** [Spring 2026 Apply to College Day \(ALL COLLEGES\) – Fill out form](#)
- **Thursday, April 2nd- Georgia State University Instant Decision Day:** Students who submitted their application to Georgia State University will receive their admissions decision during this time! Students must have submitted their application, taken the SAT or ACT, and sent their transcript via Naviance. Register here: [Georgia State University Instant Decision Day – Fill out form](#)

INSTANT DECISION DAY- GEORGIA STATE UNIVERSITY:

Georgia State University will host an Instant Decision Day on Thursday, April 2nd. Representatives from both colleges will come to Osborne to speak with seniors who submitted their application, transcript, and test scores. Seniors can receive on-the-spot admission decisions during their meeting.

SENDING TRANSCRIPTS TO COLLEGE:

As students are completing college applications, please remember the process to send your transcript to the college. As a reminder, counselors can only send your transcript through Naviance. Please make sure you complete all steps listed below for your transcript to be sent.

Step 1: Make sure your college is in Naviance and marked as “application submitted”

- You must add the college(s) you’ve applied to in Naviance (see instructions below)
- Applications must already be submitted before requesting a transcript.

Step 2: Pay the one-time \$2 transcript fee

- There is a **one-time \$2 fee** to send your transcript. Please do not pay more than once.
- Pay online at www.MyPaymentsPlus.com (look for Senior Transcript)

How to add your colleges in Naviance:

1. Students can access Naviance through Clever OR go to www.cobbk12.org → Click **FIND IT FAST** (upper right corner) → Click **Naviance** → **Login with SAML** and sign in using your student email and password.
2. Click **“Colleges I’m Applying To.”**
 - **If applying through CommonApp**, make sure to match your CommonApp and Naviance by clicking “MATCH ACCOUNTS” in the red bar at the top of the page.
 1. Edit each college and check “Application Submitted.”
 - **If you did not apply through CommonApp**, click on the blue circle **(+)** and add the college you applied to (You must check that the application has been submitted)

CAP & GOWN ORDER

If you have not ordered your cap & gown for May’s Commencement Ceremony, please do so as soon as possible.

You can order through this website: <https://atlgrad.com/> (Click Graduation → Osborne → choose a package or select “Shop Individual Items” at the bottom of the page to order just the cap & gown)

The Cap & Gown will be delivered to Osborne in March and students will be able to pick-up their order during the school day.

COLLEGE INFORMATIONAL SESSION:

University of Arkansas will be hosting an info session on **Wednesday, February 11th at 12:30 PM** in the **Counseling Career Center**. This info session is open to all grade levels and should last 30 minutes.

Students must register in Naviance to attend:

1. Log into Naviance through Clever
2. Look under “What’s New” on the home page
3. Click **More Info → Register**

GRADUATION VERIFICATION:

During Advisement on January 27th, seniors received a copy of their graduation status check and transcript. They went through the process of verifying they are correctly scheduled for graduation in May. If you are concerned about your graduation status, please contact your counselor immediately.

SAT/ACT INFORMATION AND REGISTRATION SESSION:

The SAT and ACT are college entrance exams that may be required for college admissions. Students who are applying to the University System of Georgia colleges below are now required to submit test scores with their application:

- August University
- Georgia College & State University
- Georgia State University
- Georgia Southern University
- Georgia Tech
- Kennesaw State University
- University of Georgia

Other colleges may require scores to be submitted based on your GPA. For more information, please refer to college admissions website for details on their test score policy.

Counseling hosts registration sessions every other week to assist students with the registration process. Students can also register for the test for free. Our next SAT/ACT registration session will be held on **Monday, February 2nd**.

Students who qualify for a fee waiver can pick up a form from the Counseling Office. Once signed by a parent/guardian and returned, the student will be invited to the registration session to receive a fee waiver code and complete their test registration.

Students should send their scores to the Georgia Student Finance Commission to be considered for the **Zell Miller Scholarship** (code 2225).

FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID (FAFSA):

The 2026-2027 FAFSA is now open! Students and parents should also be focused on completing the FAFSA for money to help pay for school. The FAFSA should be completed as soon as possible to be considered for financial aid. Students should complete the application with their parents/guardians using their 2024 tax information.

The FAFSA is required for federal and state financial aid programs- including the HOPE/Zell Miller Scholarship, Federal Pell Grants, and student loans. This must be completed every year you are in college.

HOPE & ZELL MILLER SCHOLARSHIP & GPA

Students who are attending a Georgia college or university may be eligible for either the HOPE Scholarship or the Zell Miller Scholarship. Students can apply for both by completing the FAFSA or the GSFAPP through GaFutures.

To check your HOPE GPA, students can create their account on www.gafutures.org. Osborne must have the student's social security number on file for students to be eligible for HOPE or Zell Miller.

STEPS AFTER APPLYING TO COLLEGE:

Are you unsure of what to do after you submit your application? Follow these suggested steps:

1. Make sure your Official transcript is sent through Naviance
 - a. See the [Sending Transcripts to College](#) section below
 - b. You can monitor this in Naviance under the "Colleges I'm Applying to" dashboard
2. Send your SAT/ACT test scores to the colleges you applied to (*if required by college*)
 - a. SAT test scores are sent through Collegeboard
 - b. ACT test scores are sent through ACT
 - c. Send your test scores to the **Georgia Student Finance Commission** to be considered for the Zell Miller Scholarship
3. Follow-up regarding teacher letters of recommendation that may be required
 - a. Letters of Recommendation are requested through Naviance
 - b. You may need to complete a "brag sheet" for the teachers
4. Monitor the status of your application
 - a. It takes time for colleges to review applications and make decisions
 - b. Check you application status by monitoring your email or logging into the college's student application portal
 - c. You can also track if your transcript, scores, or other materials have been received by the college in the application portal
5. Apply to scholarships and financial aid
 - a. Complete the **2026-2027 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)** to apply for federal, state, and potential institutional money
 - b. If you are unable to complete the FAFSA, be sure to complete the **GSFAPP** in GaFutures to apply for Georgia state financial aid
 - c. If the college requires it, you can complete your CSS Profile in CollegeBoard- **not every college asks for this**
 - d. Apply for the local scholarships highlighted in the **Osborne Scholarship Newsletter**- there are several scholarships guaranteed to go to Osborne students- you need to apply!
6. After receiving your acceptances, make your final decision
 - a. In your acceptance email, you will be provided with "Next Steps" from the college that you must follow if you plan to attend
 - b. You will submit your enrollment deposit to the college and confirm that you are attending

- c. **IN MAY 2026**- Be sure to request your **Final Transcript** to be sent to your “Attending” college when we complete the Class of 2026 Graduation Survey in Naviance
 - i. Your Final Transcript is the proof that you graduated high school and will be sent after graduation to your “Attending” college.
